RM Easimaths

For the past few years, we have been using the RM Maths Learning System to provide focussed Maths tasks for all the children, specifically targetted at individuals' ability and to support the identification of pupils' problems and teachers' assessment of their progress. This has been an extremely useful tool and this year we have decided to upgrade to an on-line RM Easimaths to make sure that the programmes used keeps up to date with curriculum changes and also that the tasks capture children's enthusiasm.

With three junior classes having just switched, this final aim has certainly succeeded, so much so that children have asked if they can carry on with Easimaths at home. It's great to know that everone seems to be enjoying their Maths, but because of the way that we use the information and our experience is that regular use of short target sessions is the most effective way of using this resource it would not be appropriate for us to use it for homework or for children to log on to it at home. Please therefore, do not try to access the RM site from home – there are other learning sites and we'd like to keep this one 'in-house'. Thank you.
