## Marlborough School Apple Day - This Friday, 7<sup>th</sup> October - 14:00

A day late this week – my apologies but I wanted to clear a couple of things in school before issuing the week's newsletter.

### School Mealtimes

Alongside the other infants, the new y0 class have taken to their meals with eager appetites and, through the supervisors' support are getting a good feel for our dining room ethos balanced with time outside. We want to ensure that all the children are able to make as much use of their lunch break as possible, sharing meals in a relaxed fashion and still making the most of the rest of their mid-day break. This will involve trialling different arrangements for the way juniors come in for their meals and the children's school parliament will review these through this term. From time to time we do find ourselves short of dining room help – if you are interested in becoming a lunchtime supervisor and can be available to provide cover at fairly short notice, please let us know at the office (as often as not these 'cover appointments' can develop into more permanent arrangements).



As mentioned before, the governing body has now discussed and agreed the need for Marlborough to operate a **nut-free** policy. ### Y2 exit arrangements

Also from tomorrow, to ease congestion along the infant footpaths, class 2 will be releasing y2 children to parents from the main doorway. The main vehicle access gate will be closed, so it will be easier to keep clear of the wooden gate but please remember this is a car park and keep children away from staff cars. Thank you.
