Dear Parents

Thank you everybody for your sensitive and respectful manner, whatever your individual views, with respect to last week's action. The clear message we received as a school was your consistent support, and for that we are very grateful. I had attended the national Association of Head Teachers' conference in Birmingham over the weekend before and, in talking with colleagues there, I was reminded yet again of the positive character of the school and family community we have at Marlborough. It really is a privilege to work with the team here, you and your children. And despite the government's Academy U-turn, I think we are going to need to draw on the strength of our partnership in the months ahead. Whilst the relaxation of the demand to force all schools to convert is something of a relief, the White Paper proposes other measures that will put significant pressure on the authority's ability to support schools and thus on our resources. Additionally, the messages about the curriculum and assessment demands are already loud. At Marlborough we will continue to ensure that children's learning experiences are positive and stimulating: as much as aiming for children to be ready for secondary school our desire will always be that they retain their curiosity and enthusiasm for learning as they move on from Marlborough. Whilst there are questions about the ks2 tests this year, the children of class 6 are ready for them and all of our best wishes support them as they begin the process of celebrating their primary school achievements this week.

## y6 Breakfast Club – this week, 9-13 May



We're putting on a breakfast club for class 6 this week. All those who wanted to have signed up for the days that they wish to come and will need to be in school for an 08:00 service. Entry at this time is only for the children taking their ks2 SATs. Other than for these breakfast arrangements, we would like

to remind everyone of the need to follow the instructions below for **Morning and Afternoon Drop-Off and Collection** times:

- doors open at 08:30 – any children arriving early can wait (with parents, or as appropriate, without) either at the entrance or in the pavilion/waiting shelter – children should not use the playground before or during the morning opening time and the car-park itself is out-of-bounds for play for safety reasons
- please do not park in Ferndale Road waiting for the bell with children in the car (in fact **please do not** drive into Ferndale Road at all)
- please ensure that all children are at school in time for them to be **in class** for registration by **08:45**
- children may only enter school at earlier times when the doors are opened to them by the coordinator of any morning activities (eg table tennis) or by special arrangement
- please collect children promptly at the end of the school day: we have found an increasing number of children being kept waiting for collection for up to 30 minutes after home time and also a growing number of times when children wait in school for other children to finish an after school club as they are going home together (we cannot supervise children in this situation properly as staff have many after-school responsibilities and commitments.
