School Budget 2023-2024

The Governing Body have agreed and set a budget for the financial year. It has been incredibly difficult to make the budget balance as the amount allocated to Marlborough has only increased by £20,000 from last year, (which includes the £2 billion allocation announced by the government) however the cost of energy, resources and pay increases for all staff has increased by over £60,000. This is Marlborough's story, but all schools are in the same situation. The Governors have done everything possible to ensure the provision for children at Marlborough is as focused on safety, learning and well-being as it has been previously. Many thanks to the Governing Body and Kieran Jermyn for the hours they have put in to mapping out the budget and their dedication to Marlborough School.
