Dress Code for 2023-2024

Thank you for sending your children to school looking so smart. Please remember our school dress code as published on our website:

Shoes – Children must wear safe and sensible footwear at all times. Good, sturdy and breathable trainers are ideal as they can be worn throughout the day and for PE. Open toe shoes and crocs are not permissible owing to the stairs and other trip hazards around school. Slip-on shoes are not advisable, again for safety reasons, and cannot be worn when using any of the outdoor equipment. Accessories – No jewellery (except for wrist watches and plain stud ear-rings) or make-up (including nail-varnish) should be worn in school.

PE days – Pupils in Years 1 and up are able to wear their PE kits to school on the day they do PE. Please can pupils wear their school jumper over the top of their packet ship t-shirt.

Resources for School

It would be helpful if all children had **headphones** and a simple (non-sniffy) **waterbottle** in school. Please can children in Classes 3 to 6 start the year with a **simple pencil case**, containing a **glue stick**. Please LABEL EVERYTHING THAT MOVES, especially jumpers!
