

I am delighted to confirm that Marlborough School's **Outspire our Children** application won the local Tesco Bags of Help poll and that we have been awarded the £5000 grant to help with the improvement of the outdoor area. Internet Safety

On the 27 February, the government published its aim to ensure that 'the UK becomes the safest place in the world for young people to go online.' No doubt there will be a lot of ministers' talk about this strategy and a new programme for schools to deliver for pupils. Yet the evidence is clear that parents fear that the threat from online dangers has grown far more quickly than society's response to them, and that they are worried young people are being exposed to risks that they never were and don't know how to confront. Schools' e-Safety education does need to be constantly monitored and updated – and the active support of a government department in this should be welcomed. The full story is available at:

... and I include it here as often in the months after Christmas, with increased access to mobile technology, our children struggle with the challenges of running on-line friendships alongside their relationships in school. We've had a couple of incidents in the upper juniors, and also a worrying report that younger children using games such as Roblox have received unwelcome and threatening contact from tricksters. Essentially it is very important that parents do keep in touch with children's on-line activity and that everyone is aware of age limits (nobody under 13 should be using the main social media sites). We will keep you informed of any information about the strategy and help for parents and families that we receive.
